St Vincent de Paul Society North Beach Conference Parish AGM Report 2022/23

The past year has been both a busy and challenging year for the St Vincent de Paul conference in North Beach. We have seen an increase in demand for our support across the board as many more people, single, couples and families reach out for the basic necessities of life, many of which we would normally take for granted.

The housing situation continues to cause hardship both for those who have a mortgage and those who are renting, along with this there continues to be an increase in people falling into homelessness. With your support we have been able to reach out and provide assistance in the basic necessities of life and at times ensuring that they can remain in their accommodation

We are very grateful for the ongoing support of Fr Hyginus the parish and school communities. Without you we would be unable to provide the needs of many people and could not do the work we do.

New members are always welcome, which would both lighten the load on the current members and also further increase our reach to those that require our assistance.

THE READING MINISTRY

Speaking to those who belong to the Reading Ministry, I feel that they take their contribution to the Liturgy seriously. They always 'do their best,' to read, which in this case, in liturgical situations, is spoken of as proclaiming the Word (of God'), with conviction, clarity, love and humility. Many parishioners have gone before us and I'm sure our present readers are grateful to them for leading the way.

Reading at Mass may give us a greater sense of belonging to the worshiping community. It can be an opportunity to serve the community and each other as we develop an awareness of 'bringing' the Word of God alive.

SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMME

In 2023 we saw 246 school-aged children receive sacraments.

Confirmation 88 candidates were confirmed on Pentecost Sunday 27th/28th May

Eucharist 83 candidates received their First Eucharist over two weekends 29th/30th July &

5th/6th August

Reconciliation 77 candidates made their First Reconciliation on 24th/25th October. These were week

nights then the children came to mass the next weekend to receive their certificates.

As part of their sacramental preparation, we introduced a Community Service component this year. Children were asked to attend a minimum of 3 masses over 8 weeks and participate by helping out at mass. The Year 6's came up with a list of things that could be done to assist Father, the Acolytes and the parishioners. There was a very positive response by the children and their families. We all benefitted from their assistance each week. We plan to continue this component in 2024.

The Sacramental programme would not operate with out the leadership and guidance of Fr. Hyginus. Thank you, Father. I would like to acknowledge the wonderful leadership and support provided by Gabrielle Doyle and her amazing staff who prepare the children and attend all sacramental events. I would also like to thank Deacon Paul and his band of catechists who have worked very hard to prepare the children for their sacraments. Lastly, I would like to sincerely thank all parishioners for their constant thoughts and prayers for the children and their families. The Programme would not run as well without the contribution of so many. Thank you all.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY

Children' Liturgy operates during the 9:30am Sunday Mass during school terms. There are three volunteers rostered on each week, all of whom have a current Working With Children card and have also completed the mandatory safeguarding training. Due to insufficient volunteers, Children's Liturgy is not offered for all the weeks of the school term.

On the Children's Liturgy committee are Emma Craigie, Tania Farcich and Giuliana Romeo. The committee ensure the smooth running of this ministry by ensuring activities are prepared, resources are maintained, rosters are prepared and circulated as well as reminders issued to volunteers each week. We thank our current volunteers for their dedication to this ministry and we hope new volunteers can join us in 2024.

We thank Fr Hyginus for welcoming the children at the start of the Mass and encouraging them to join the activities that have been planned, this has led to more children participating. During the time they spend with the volunteers, the children listen to the Gospel, watch a video or listen to a song relevant to the gospel reading and talk about the relevance to their lives. Finally they complete a simple craft activity or worksheet. We noticed a significant increase in attendance rates this year, especially during the period of preparation for the sacraments.

Some of our volunteers have left this ministry as their circumstances change and we thank them for offering up their time and sharing their skills with the children in our parish. We look forward to 2024 and supporting the children of our parish in learning about God and the Church.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

Eucharistic Adoration is spending an hour before the Blessed Sacrament in prayer and devotion and is the same as spending time with Jesus Himself. It is a way of giving back the love that has been extended to each one of us personally.

Jesus invites us personally saying. "Could you not watch one hour with me"?

We are very fortunate in this parish in that we have an Adoration Chapel available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The chapel is on the south side of the Parish Pastoral Centre and entry is by a 4 digit code.

There is always a need for new Adorers to be added to the roster.

As part of a global spiritual community "World Community for Christian Meditation" we are united in the practice of meditation in the Christian tradition and this nurtures our, practice with links to beautiful readings talks and other resources. #1

As part of the North Beach community, we would like to think that our faithful weekly commitment adds to the richness of spiritual life in the parish. We meet in the Parish Centre to say our opening prayer (see below), then we listen to a talk or spiritual music for a brief time and sit in silence for 20-or 30-minutes finishing with the Lord's Prayer. #2

Founded in the mid 1990's by young parents whose kids were at OLG primary school. Still meditating after 25 years Dianne, Lawrence, Linda, and Angela were taught this style of prayer by the late local WCCM leaders Sam & Vesta #3. Fr Ken Keating invited us to meditate in the parish house and offer this gift to others in the parish. Several more people saw the value of this gift and joined and supported the group "leaders" in the end becoming leaders themselves.

So now in 2023 we have seen others come and go & there are two groups. The Thursday night group has around 9 regular members who take turns leading the weekly meditation. Wednesday afternoon has 8 regular members. We treasure our gift of meditation and feel the least we could do after receiving it is to encourage others to see if this style of prayer suits them and to offer to pray with them.

On top of this we learnt new songs along the way and I must say the few ladies we had were easy to teach. Gradually some of the other ladies returned, and so did Dominica which we were thankful for.

We have come a long way since the start of the choir, we are now a confident and experienced choir, with the guidance of Dominica and the support of Father Hyginus.
